

## BATONA TRAIL RESUME'

The idea of building a hiking trail through the Wharton tract and Lebanon State Forest was first suggested by Dale Knappehauer in 1960, of the Batona Hiking Club.

P Early in 1961 the Batona Hiking Club decided that this would be a worthwhile project. Morris Bardock, <sup>then President of the Club</sup> dispatched a letter (#<sup>1</sup>, attached) to Commissioner Gantempo explaining our plans, and hoping for endorsement; but wondering whether it would be favorably received, or even ignored.

P To our pleasant surprise a most favorable reply was received (#<sup>2</sup>, attached). We were to meet with Wharton manager J. C. Mac Donald. Just about that time Mr. Mac Donald was advanced to a post in Trenton, and our first meeting was held with his assistant, Sid Walker. We had earlier received a letter from Mr. Mac Donald (#<sup>3</sup>, attached).

During the winter and early spring, <sup>1961</sup> Walt Korsyniak and Morris Bardock made about a dozen exploratory trips to lay out the exact route of the trail. <sup>Dale Knappehauer & Jim Pejciotski</sup> From June through September Korsyniak and Bardock made a series of eighteen work trips to construct the trail, by blaze marks on the trees; clearing where necessary, and avoiding difficult obstacles. Several other Batona members assisted on a few of these work trips.

The 30-mile trail was completed Sept 16, 1961. The final blaze was put on a tree about a <sup>1 1/2</sup> miles <sup>south</sup> of Deep Hollow Pond, & indicated by a blaze encircling the tree.

During the whole period a most cordial relationship had been established with Mr. Walker (who had become manager of Wharton) by a series of meetings with Korsyniak and Bardock, to discuss details, and progress.
